INCENTIVE GRANTS

One Happy Camper incentive grants: First-time overnight campers can apply to receive up to \$1000 off their first summer at camp. Grants are first come, first served and are NOT based on financial need.



Second-Year One Happy Camper incentive grants: Atlanta campers who received a One Happy Camper grant for their first summer may be eligible to receive a Second-Year One Happy Camper incentive grant up to \$500.

NEEDS-BASED SCHOLARSHIPS

Camp scholarships are available to families in financial need. Applications are reviewed by a Scholarship Committee as part of an anonymous review and allocations process. All applications and inquiries are confidential. The camp scholarship program is funded through the generosity of individual donors, grants from charitable foundations, and Jewish Federation of Greater Atlanta's Community Campaign.
